- 7. Understand the dialect Timothy uses.
- 8. Discuss the differences between the two main characters regarding
 - Prejudice
 - Optimism
 - Care for the other
 - Work
 - Survival
- 9. Define and cite examples from the book of the following literary terms:
 - Allusion
 - Climax
 - Coming of age
 - Conflict
 - Dialect
 - Foreshadowing
 - Irony
 - Narrator
 - Plot
 - Setting

- 10. Appreciate the elements of plot that make this an adventure story.

Questions for Essay and Discussion

- 1. As the first chapter opens, we discover exactly how innocent and naive the narrator is. In what way does he demonstrate his innocence? How does he view the world?
- 2. Phillip shows both a stubborn and a giving, kind side of his character in his opening dialogue with Henrik van Boven. What does he say that shows each of these traits?
- 3. What makes the island of Curacao so important that the Germans would come all the way from Europe to bomb it?
- 4. At what point in the story does Phillip begin to understand the true meaning of war? Compare this to how he feels and behaves previously concerning the War.
- 5. Describe Phillip's mother and father.
- 6. The author foreshadows events that may happen in the future. Why do you think the author uses foreshadowing?
- 7. After the boat is torpedoed, Phillip meets Timothy for the first time. Discuss how Phillip's words let the reader know how he feels about Timothy without actually expressing any feelings aloud.
- 8. Does Timothy's use of dialect affect the reader's perception of his character? How?
- 9. In Chapter three, Timothy shows wisdom and intellect, but Phillip shows his immaturity. Discuss how you think these differences may contribute to the developing plot?
- 10. What are several kind things Timothy does for Phillip despite Phillip's obvious disdain for him? Explain why Philip does not see them as kind.
- 11. Timothy seems to be a man of common sense. What superstitious belief does he hold that seem contradictory to his usually consistent common sense attitude and actions?
- 12. Why does Timothy want to land on the island? Why does Phillip not want to? Which character do you agree with? Why?
- 13. In Chapter eight, Timothy decides to go to the reef to catch lobster. Why does Phillip become angry with Timothy and how does his anger color his feelings toward Timothy?
