Figurative Devices

- 01 **Plot** the sequence of interconnected events that occur within a narrative; a plot tells what, when, and why the events happened.
- **02 Setting** when and where the short story, play, or novel takes place
- **03 Conflict** the struggle that sets the plot in motion and then moves the action forward; the challenges characters face throughout a story
- 04 Characterization the methods, incidents, speech, and other elements an author uses to reveal a character; it is depicted by what the character says, what others say, and by the character's actions.
- **05 Theme** the central or dominant idea behind the story; it is usually expressed indirectly, as an element the reader must humanity, rather than a simple statement
 - figure out. It is a universal statement about dealing with plot or characters in the story.



Point of View – the way a story is told and the relationship between the story and the person who tells it

- **07 Language** the style, tone, and mood an author uses to tell the story
- **Figurative Devices** words and phrases used to communicate ideas in more poetic and effective ways than literal language
