Mary Wollstonecraft Shelley was born on August 30, 1797, to philosopher William Godwin and feminist writer Mary Wollstonecraft in London, England. When she was 16, Mary eloped with Percy Bysshe Shelley, a renowned Romantic poet. During a trip to Switzerland in 1816, after a challenge by the

poet Lord Byron, Mary wrote a ghost story that would later be published as *Frankenstein*. After Percy's unexpected death in 1822, Mary continued to write novels, including *Valperga* and *Lodore*. Mary passed away from a brain tumor on February 1, 1851.
