

Watch for dangling modifier conditions ahead.

EXAMPLE

DANGLING MODIFIER:

Racing down the road, the speedometer registered 70 mph.

MODIFIED:

The speedometer registered 70 mph as the car raced down the road.



EXAMPLE

FRAGMENT

Stepping down hard on the pedal.

SENTENCE

Stepping down hard on the pedal, John barely beat the red light.



Fix that pronoun problem.

EXAMPLE

BROKEN PRONOUN

Everybody takes care of their first car the best way possible.

REPAIRED PRONOUN

Everybody takes care of his or her first car the best way possible.



Don't shift tenses in midsentence.

EXAMPLE

TENSE VIOLATION:

She will fix her Jaguar just as soon as the insurance paid for it.

PROPER TENSE AGREEMENT:

She will fix her Jaguar just as soon as the insurance will pay for it.



Put the brakes on that run-on sentence.

EXAMPLE

RUN-ON:

Paying attention to signs is critical otherwise, you will get lost.

SENTENCE:

Paying attention to signs is critical; otherwise, you will get lost.



Remember where you parked that modifier.

EXAMPLE

ILLEGALLY PARKED MODIFIER

I repainted my Honda in my garage, which used to be green.

LEGALLY PARKED MODIFIER

I repainted my Honda, which used to be green, in my garage.



Avoid aggressive subject/verb disagreements.

EXAMPLE

VERB DISAGREEMENT:

The assistance of a mechanic and computer experts are necessary.

VERB AGREEMENT

The assistance of a mechanic and computer experts is necessary.



Repair comma splices before proceeding.

EXAMPLE

COMMA SPLICE:

The winners laughed, the losers cried.

SENTENCE:

The winners laughed, but the losers cried.
