syn: unveil; disclose

ant: conceal

abet

The piano accompanist **abetted** the ridiculous singer on the TV talent show and made her look even worse.

v. to assist or encourage, especially in wrongdoing

syn: promote; incite

ant: impede; dissuade

Lesson One

dogmatic

Dogmatic politicians who reject their constituents' views usually get voted out of office.

adj. arrogant and stubborn about one's (often unproven) beliefs

syn: dictatorial

ant: open-minded
