ant: tongue-tied; unclear

(v) *syn:* enunciate; pronounce

ant: mumble; murmur

n. the main or most important point or feature
syn: core; root; center

debris

So many vehicles collided that clean-up crews took hours removing **debris** from the road.

n. scattered remnants; rubble
syn: *ruins; waste*
