n. a deviation from what is normal or proper
syn: irregularity; abnormality
ant: regularity; normality

bequeath

History has **bequeathed** a legacy of triumphs and failures to us.

v. to leave to another by will after one's death
(law usage); to hand down
syn: *leave; bestow*

Lesson One

capitulate

Though vastly outnumbered, the Spartans refused to **capitulate** to the Persian invaders.

v. to surrender
syn: cede; yield
ant: endure; resist
