Germany, arithmetic, basketball, neighborhood, school, homes, castle, Derek, music, peanuts, city

dog, teacher, space, canoe, freedom, George Washington, happiness, Mr. Johnson, group, friendship, guitar

### Nouns

As you can see, all of the examples have something in common: They all are *people*, *places*, *things*, or *emotions*.

People	George Washington, Mr. Johnson, teacher
Places	New York, Germany, Mississippi River
Things	canoe, number, freedom
Emotions	thrill, love, happiness

### Nouns

A noun that does not begin with a capital letter is called a *common noun*. If a noun begins with a capital letter, though, it is called a *proper noun*.

# What's wrong with this sentence?

Henry gave Ann and Ann's twin sister Annette a birthday card, but Ann said to Henry that Ann and Ann's twin sister Annette's birthday was next week.

## There are too many repeated names in the sentence. It sounds awful!

Wouldn't the sentence sound better like this?

Henry gave Ann and her twin sister Annette a birthday card, but Ann said to him that their birthday was next week.

Of course it would! What happened was to replace the people's names with pronouns. *Pronouns* take the place of nouns.
