

The Latin verb **GIGNERE**, **GENITUS** means "to give birth" or "create."



SUFFIX ALARM!

The suffix –al means "having the quality or physical makeup of something."

Examples:

accident + al = accidental—happening by chance

alphabetic + al = alphabetical—arranged in the order of the alphabet
